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Community Group Questions

Read Colossians 4:5-6, Matthew 5:13-16, 1 Thessalonians 4:9-12, Philippians 1:27, 1 Peter 2:12, and Titus 2:9-12, 3:14.

1. What does Paul the Apostle ask for in Colossians 4:3?

Do you spend much time asking for the same thing? How do you think your witnessing might be affected if you did?

2. What does it mean to make the most of every opportunity?
3. Either from your own experience of speaking with unbelievers or what you might expect from them, what kinds of questions do they have about your faith, Christianity in general, and the church?

Do you feel equipped to deal with these questions? Why, or why not?

4. In Colossians 4:5, Paul speaks of those who do not have a personal relationship with Jesus as “outsiders.” Obviously, in using this term he was speaking to “insiders” or believers! The advice he gives us is to use wisdom in the way we conduct ourselves around outsiders. What might this look like?
 5. Give an example of speech that is infused with grace. Why is this so important when dealing with those who don’t know the Lord?
 6. Why should we try to avoid “cookie cutter” approaches to evangelism?
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
